

CANNON HILL CATHOLIC PARISH CENTENARY CELEBRATION



A Message from Archbishop Mark Coleridge

The centenary of the parish of Cannon Hill is one of many celebrated in recent years in the Archdiocese of Brisbane. This is because Archbishop Duhig had been frustrated in his years as Coadjutor because the old and frail Archbishop Dunne would not give him the cheque-book. Duhig saw the need to buy and build, but Dunne insisted that it was more important to build the community than to buy land and build buildings.

In 1917, however, Duhig became Archbishop and got the cheque-book. Land was bought, churches, schools were built and parishes were established in those years after WorldWar I. This was not only because Duhig was in charge but also because the surge of new energy offered a sign of hope for the future after the horrors of the War.

In 1921 the church, dedicated to the then Blessed Oliver Plunkett, was opened; but the parish was not established until 1925. In the meantime, much has changed in the Church and the world. There has been the Great Depression, World War II and the vast social changes since then; and in the Church there has been the Second Vatican Council which has led to deep and lasting change in the Church. Blessed Oliver has become Saint Oliver; and thirteen priests have served in the parish, diocesan clergy of Anglo-Celtic background making way for Oblate priests of Sri Lankan background.

Yet through all the change, the parish of Cannon Hill, under the patronage of the martyred Archbishop of Armagh, has stood as a witness to what does not change: the boundless love of God which gathers people together in the bond of faith and the call to mission. That is as true now as it was a hundred years ago.

I give thanks to God for the remarkable journey of these hundred years and for all the parishioners, living and dead, who have been part of the story. I also pray that the future of the parish will honour the past, building upon the great legacy of faith, hope and love that has made the parish of Cannon Hill such a gift not only to the Archdiocese but to society as a whole.

THIS WEEK'S GOSPEL - LUKE 12:13-21

To whom will all this wealth of yours go?

A man in the crowd said to. Jesus, 'Master, tell my brother to give me a share of our inheritance.' 'My friend,' he replied 'who appointed me your judge, or the arbitrator of your claims?' Then he said to them, 'Watch, and be on your guard against avarice of any kind, for a man's life is not made secure by what he owns, even when he has more than he needs.'

Then he told them a parable: 'There was once a rich man who, having a good harvest from his land, thought to himself, "What am I to, do? I have not enough room to store my crops." Then he said, "This is what I will do: I will pull down my barns and build bigger ones, and store all my grain and my goods in them, and I will say, to my soul: 'My soul, you have plenty of good things laid by for many years to come; take things easy, eat, drink, have a good time." 
