FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT—YEAR B

18th FEBRUARY 2024

Dear Parishioners and Friends!

We are now in the great Season of **Lent**. During the season of Lent, the church invites us to examine our lives, to repent and do penance, by means of fasting, acts of devotion and prayers.

The purpose of Lent is above all to prepare the Children of God for the celebration of the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. The better the preparation for this day, the more effective the celebration will be.

The second purpose is to renew our Baptismal promises of rejecting Satan and accepting Jesus as our Lord and Saviour, allowing him to rule our lives.

Both these aims demand purification of minds and hearts. The Church tries to achieve this goal by leading her children to a true "repentance," and by renewal of life through self-control, and practice of the corporal and spiritual works of mercy.

The Church invites all to repent from evil ways and return to the Lord, who is eagerly waiting for us, as a Prodigal Father.

The first Sunday of **Lent** gives us the example of Jesus' temptation as a model to overcome our own temptations. People are very much tempted by power, food, prestige, name and so on. These are the very things that people are looking for nowadays. They are ready to lose anything and everything to attain these.

People who are starving are ready to do any kind of work to get a handful of bread or rice. When you are hungry, you do not worry about anything other than something to satisfy your hunger. The people who are longing for power and want to attain that power are ready for anything. At any cost, they want to get power. They do not worry about the means, all they want is power. It is the same with people who are looking for prestige. However, Jesus tells us not to work for mere food, power or prestige, but to work for kingdom of God.

Long for God's power and eternal life. Try to satisfy God, not people or material things.

This is the sacred time to evaluate our personal life and to get back to the root of our faith. Power, food, prestige or name can quench our thirst temporarily, but not permanently. They cannot satisfy us fully. Only God can do that, for He has the words of eternal life.

Let us conquer our temptations with the power of God as Jesus did, by using the methods of prayer, self-denial and timely use of the word of God. During this Lent, let us confront our evil tendencies by talking to God and by listening to Him.

We now turn to Him and say "Be merciful, O Lord, for we have sinned".


40 Days for Life Prayer Vigil


