Dear Parishioners and Friends!

Transformation is a dramatic change in form or appearance. Personal transformation is how we change who we are, what we do, and the life we lead. It is a journey. We are subjected to transformation from the moment of our conception. We undergo this process until we die.

Transformation is both *Physical* and *Spiritual*. There are certain transformations taking place in our physical body, in the process of our growth which we experience.

In the same way there should be also a Spiritual transformation in our lives. From the time of our Baptism to the end our life, we are expected to go through this Spiritual transformation. There might be a change in our personal life as well as in our spiritual life. This transformation must lead us to transfiguration.

This spiritual transformation will not happen randomly or suddenly. There are certain things that will be demanded from us. We must be open to change, ready to accept the challenges and make sacrifices; do some charitable work, spend some time in prayer and listening to His voice, receiving Sacraments and so on, because, **no pain, no gain**. That is what we see in the life of Jesus. Before His glorification, He underwent untold suffering and a brutal death (murder). The golden opportunity to transform is granted to us, through this sacred season of Lent.

In today's Gospel, Jesus gives His Disciples the foretaste of the eternal life or eternal Glory. Jesus was transfigured before His disciples. He showed them the life which is waiting for Him and for us after this earthly life. Before this glorification, He must go through His suffering and death and Resurrection.

The primary purpose of Jesus' Transfiguration was to allow him to consult his Heavenly Father and ascertain His plan for His Son's suffering, death, and Resurrection. His aim was also to make Jesus' chosen disciples aware of Jesus' Divine glory, so that they might discard their worldly ambitions and dreams of a conquering political Messiah and be strengthened in their time of trial.

The readings give us an invitation as well as a challenge to put our Faith in the loving promises of a merciful God who sent His Son to die for us and to transform our lives by renewing them during Lent.

So, during this grace filled season of Lent, let us listen to His consoling words. Moreover, let us offer our Lenten sacrifices to our Lord so that, through these practices of Lent and through the acceptance of our daily crosses, we may grow closer to Jesus in his suffering, may share in the carrying of his cross, and finally, may share the glory, which He revealed to His disciples in the Gospel today.

Gospel for 11th February - Mark 9: 2-10

Six days later, Jesus took with him Peter and James and John, and led them up a high mountain apart, by themselves. And he was transfigured before them, and his clothes became dazzling white, such as no one on earth could bleach them. And there appeared to them Elijah with Moses, who were talking with Jesus. Then Peter said to Jesus, "Rabbi, it is good for us to be here; let us make three dwellings, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah." He did not know what to say, for they were terrified. Then a cloud overshadowed them, and from the cloud there came a voice, "This is my Son, the Beloved; listen to him!" Suddenly when they looked around, they saw no one with them any more, but only Jesus.

As they were coming down the mountain, he ordered them to tell no one about what they had seen, until after the Son of Man had risen from the dead. So they kept the matter to themselves, questioning what this rising from the dead could mean.


