

Dear Parishioners and Friends!

"The greatest sign of God's love for us is the fact that He sent His only Son into this world.

He died in order to save us from our sins".

We are about to begin the <u>Season of Lent</u>. We begin this grace filled Season with **Ash Wednesday**. It is not too far, next Wednesday is Ash Wednesday.

When the Priest places the ashes on our head, he says either, "Remember, man, that you are dust, and unto dust you shall return" or "Repent and believe in the Gospel".

These ashes are a sign that we are entering into a time of penance. It is also a message that our life is not permanent, so, use this life to attain the imperishable life.

During this **Season of Lent**, we are encouraged to reflect more on the life of Jesus, especially, of His passion, suffering and death. Moreover, this season invites us to do fasting, penance and charitable acts, and, at the same time, it calls us to spend more time in prayer and reflecting on our personal life.

Lent is the season of prayer and fasting. It also a time of preparation for the great and solemn Liturgy on the Easter Sunday. Let us enter this holy Season with open arms in order to receive the grace of God. Let us unite all our pains, suffering and struggles with the suffering of Jesus and ask Him to give us strength to bear them all.

Today is the Sixth Sunday of Ordinary Time and the Liturgy of the Word calls us to be more generous, kind, compassionate, merciful and to reach out and touch someone.

All three readings of this Sunday teach us that we are called to become pure and holy, but we don't become holy by just ritual observances. We become holy by confessing our sins to God and offering our lives for God's glory and by sharing God's love with everyone around us and without discriminating against anyone based on colour, race, culture, religion, lifestyle, wealth or social status.

In today's Gospel, Jesus felt sorry for the leper. He "stretched out His hand and touched him ... and he was made clean." Jesus gives us the strong teaching that there is no one in the world who is untouchable. Everyone is a child of God. We as children of God must be ready to go beyond the man-made barriers and borders to help our neighbours.

During the Season of Lent, we are invited to do such things. So, let us reach out our hands and touch someone.

Gospel for 11th February - Mark 1: 40-45

A leper came to him begging him, and kneeling he said to him, "If you choose, you can make me clean."

Moved with pity, Jesus stretched out his hand and touched him, and said to him, "I do choose. Be made clean!"

Immediately the leprosy left him, and he was made clean.

After sternly warning him he sent him away at once, saying to him, "See that you say nothing to anyone; but go, show yourself to the priest, and offer for your cleansing what Moses commanded, as a testimony to them."

But he went out and began to proclaim it freely, and to spread the word, so that Jesus could no longer go into a town openly, but stayed out in the country; and people came to him from every quarter.

Sacrament of Confirmation

The Parish is offering children enrolment in its 2024 program. Confirmation completes what took place at Baptism which is the first Sacrament of Christian Initiation.

When a child is Baptised, it is generally at the request of their parents with the name their parents have given them.

In Grade 3 (generally the year when children turn eight) or later, a Baptised child is sealed with the gift of the Holy Spirit in the Sacrament of Confirmation.

Older Baptised children are also welcome to be Confirmed if they haven't had a chance to do so.
