Dear Parishioners and Friends!

We are in the third week of Lent. Moreover, during these days, in a special way we are called to reflect upon our way of behaviour.

God created man in His own image. We are with body and soul. With flesh. In every person, we find the character of the Creator. Humankind is a sensitive creature. We are with our senses. Many times, we are addicted to our senses and feelings. Our body needs pleasure and satisfaction. Therefore, our thoughts and deeds are more about satisfying our body than the soul. There are also times when we are controlled by our senses. In those moments, we do not know what to do. Getting angry is a best example of that situation.

Getting angry is normal for a human being, but excessive anger can cause problems and not good for even health. We need to reflect and see why we get angry. For what reason am I getting angry? What is happening to me when I get angry?

We can name anger, like righteous anger, good anger and healthy anger.

Today in the Liturgy of the Word, we come across a person who is angry with the people who turned a place of worship into a marketplace. That person is none other than our Lord Jesus Christ. Indeed, it would have had a great surprise for the people who were surrounding the Temple, because a man who was preaching love, kindness and asking people to forgive one another, is now getting angry and beating them all.

Obviously, Jesus was perfect in every way, so we must be very careful not to equate His anger with our normal experience of anger. It was different from what we normally experience. His anger was an anger that resulted from His perfect love, out of concern for the people and for the lack of reverence.

In the history of the world, a few good exemplary people got angry and raised their voices against the injustice done to their fellow brothers and sisters and to humanity.

Abraham Lincoln was angry about slavery. **Martin Luther King Jr.** was angry about racial discrimination, **Mahatma Gandhi** was angry about the racial discrimination against the "untouchables" by the "high castes" in India, **Nelson Mandela** was angry about apartheid in South Africa ... all that was righteous anger. The Lord has given us examples that show most healthy human beings are angry inside when they see evil and injustice being done to someone.

According to Aristotle, "Anyone can be angry. But to be angry with the right person, to the right degree, at the right time, with the right purpose ... that is not easy." Let us look at ourselves and ask "Am I disturbed when I see injustice done to people?" Am I disturbed when I see the sacred places of worship are disrespected? How do I react to such situation? Am I getting angry in such situations like Jesus? That is a healthy and righteous anger.

Today's Gospel pictures the righteous, healthy anger of Jesus. Let us learn from him and work for the less fortunate and needy, those neglected both politically and spiritually.

Let us raise our voice for the voiceless and those who are crying for justice.

Gospel for 3rd March - John 2: 13-25

The Passover of the Jews was near, and Jesus went up to Jerusalem. In the temple he found people selling cattle, sheep, and doves, and the money changers seated at their tables. Making a whip of cords, he drove all of them out of the temple, both the sheep and the cattle. He also poured out the coins of the money changers and overturned their tables. He told those who were selling the doves, "Take these things out of here! Stop making my Father's house a marketplace!" His disciples remembered that it was written, "Zeal for your house will consume me." The Jews then said to him, "What sign can you show us for doing this?" Jesus answered them, "Destroy this temple, and in three days I will raise it up." The Jews then said, "This temple has been under construction for forty-six years, and will you raise it up in three days?" But he was speaking of the temple of his body. After he was raised from the dead, his disciples remembered that he had said this; and they believed the scripture and the word that Jesus had spoken.

When he was in Jerusalem during the Passover festival, many believed in his name because they saw the signs that he was doing. 24But Jesus on his part would not entrust himself to them, because he knew all people 25and needed no one to testify about anyone; for he himself knew what was in everyone.




40 Days for Life Prayer Vigil


