FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT—YEAR B

Dear Parishioners and Friends!

"Create a clean heart in me, O God."

The heart is the symbol of love. It can be destroyed or abused by heavy drinking, smoking and by other injurious means. In a similar way, our hearts can also be blemished by our bad habits and behaviours.

In today's Responsorial Psalm, the Psalmist cries out to God to create in him a clean heart. Why was he crying out to create in him a clean heart? What had happened to his clean and pure heart?

In the beginning, God created human beings with clean and pure hearts, but humankind failed to listen to the voice of God. It broke away from the commandment of God and sinned by listening to the word of Satan. This is where the downfall of humanity started.

Moreover, from that moment onwards and up to now, our hearts are made unclean by impure thoughts, bad ideas, revenge, racism, selfishness, lust and so on. By our actions, we have created a distance between us and God, and between us and our neighbours. We have even become enemies to one another.

So, there is a grave need in each one of us to come to a settlement with God and one another. We need to be cleansed from our sins. We need to get rid of our wrong doings. We need to get back to our original place and turn away from our evil ways.

The Psalmist felt that incredible need. Moreover, he felt the absence of God in his life. Without God he was nothing, he felt the emptiness in his life, so, he was crying aloud to God to wipe away his sins and make him clean again. He was pretty sure that, if his heart was not clean or pure, he would lose the presence of God. God can not dwell in him, therefore, he was asking pardon and pleading God to put in him a new heart.

We are very close to the end of the season of Lent, there are just two more weeks to end this grace filled season. During Lent, we are invited to cry aloud and be cleansed from our sins, especially from the SEVEN CAPITAL or **DEADLY SINS** such as:

1. Pride. 2. Greed. 3. Envy. 4. Anger. 5. Lust. 6. Gluttony. and 7. Sloth.

Moreover, through the liturgy of the Word of God we are asked to put on a new heart. The Season of Lent also invites us to do some charitable acts as a penance for our sins, to attain the mercy of God. We are also asked to do the corporal works of mercy such as:

- 1. Feed the hungry. 2. Give drink to the thirsty. 3. Clothe the naked.
- 4. Shelter the homeless. 5. Visit the sick. 6. Visit the imprisoned. and 7. Bury the dead.

So, dear brethren! Let us try our best to keep our hearts clean...and be humble enough to confess our sins and ask pardon from God through the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

Volunteer Focus: Readers

Volunteers read Biblical texts (other than the Gospel) at Masses. At the Saturday vigil and Sunday Masses there are two readings. The first, usually from the Old Testament, reflect important themes from the Gospel reading. The second is usually from one of the epistles, a letter written to an early church community. Other Masses generally have one reading. The reader will usually also proclaim the Alleluia Verse and Responsorial Psalm.

A book called "Break Open the Word" is available to help readers prepare for the task, giving guidance to the context of the Biblical texts and tips on how to read difficult verses.

Please contact Catherine or the office if you would like to be a reader. You do not need to be a registered volunteer to read at Masses.

The "Second Rite of Reconciliation" is often celebrated in parishes during Advent and Lent.

This communal form of the Sacrament of Penance begins with a celebration of the Word – readings from scripture, hymns, prayers, a homily and an examination of conscience, followed by a call to repentance.

Private confession and reconciliation follow.

The Rite concludes with a short thanksgiving and a blessing and dismissal of the gathered assembly.




40 Days for Life Prayer Vigil
